There are lots of upgrades and maintenance works taking place or about to start around the school:

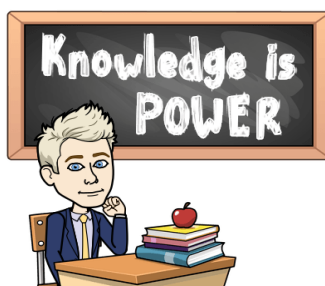
- The asphalt in front of Block A (Centipede building) is going to be levelled and replaced.

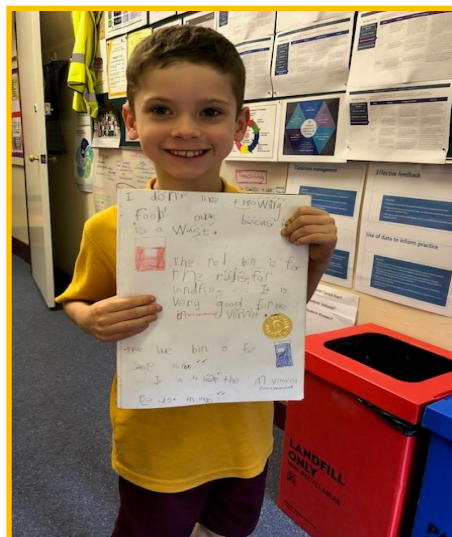
This week we farewelled our volunteer Clare who has been working with Kindy for 2 years now.

Outstanding Work Across the School

During the week, I ask teachers to send students to visit my office and show me the work they have been undertaking in class. This is an opportunity for me to hear about the learning that is taking place and engage in conversations with students about the relevance of this learning. I am continually impressed with the ability of our students to articulate the purpose of their learning and the confidence they display in doing so.



2020 Planning

The school is engaging in preliminary planning for 2020. This planning includes options for class organisation and structure as well as staffing and student placement. Parents can assist in this process by notifying the school if your child is not expected to return to the school next year. Similarly, if you are taking extended leave and are unlikely to return by the beginning of the school year, it is important that you notify the school in writing, so that a class placement is held for your child.

The class placement process is completed by teachers of the current year level (i.e. Year 4 teachers confer on Year 5 class groupings) and is overseen by the school leadership team. A substantial amount of time is put into this process considering the academic, social and emotional needs of each child. Other factors to be considered include ensuring a balance of students at each academic level within the class, friendship groupings and specific student needs. At times, there is particular information that you as a parent, may like considered as part of this process. While it is not always possible to accommodate specific requests, we do always carefully consider information shared by parents.

Next week, we will provide information about the planned class structures for 2020 with detailed information about the reasoning behind these decisions.

Air Conditioning Update

Under the Cooler Classrooms program, Glebe Public School was successful as a school to receive air conditioning.

We have received notice from School Infrastructure that these works will commence after June 2020. We are currently investigating interim measures to ensure that classrooms and teaching spaces are comfortable for our staff and students.

Kamay Botany Bay National Park

Students in 1A had a wonderful time on the Stage One excursion to Kamay Botany Bay National Park. They investigated the amazing natural and human features of the Kurnell peninsular. They explored the bushland and beach habitats of the park and identified ways we can care for these beautiful environments. During the fieldwork exercise students developed their understanding of mapping conventions and followed a map to discover traditional Aboriginal symbols.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) at Glebe Public School

As part of commitment to ensuring a positive, engaging and successful school experience for all students, Glebe Public School has started our journey as becoming a PBL school.

Today we had our first meeting and we look forward to sharing more information with you over the coming weeks, as parent and community involvement is a pivotal part of this program.

In the meantime, below is some general information about PBL

There are three specific aspects to PBL:

- **universal focus** – to create a preventative, positive learning environment for all students
- **targeted interventions** – to improve social-emotional skills for students who need additional support
- **individualised intensive supports** - for students who have experienced academic and behavioural difficulties over an extended period of time.



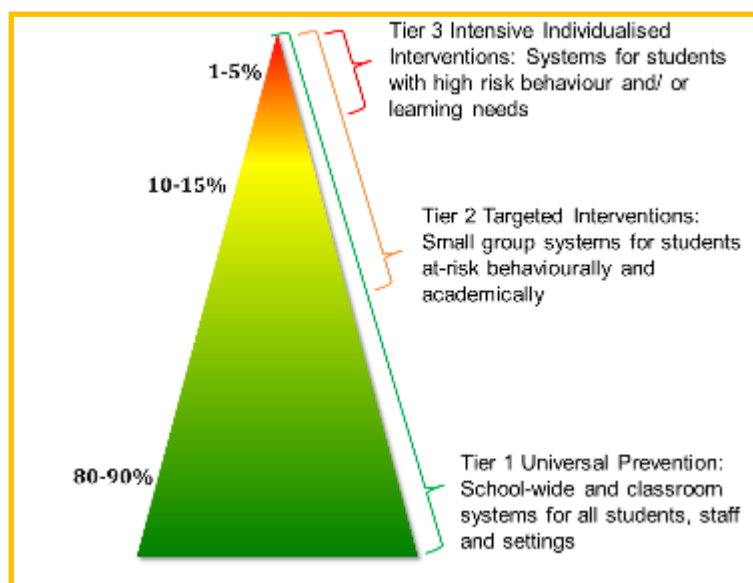
Together, this three step process is known as developing a continuum of support. PBL uses a tiered intervention framework which uses varied levels of support for students based on their needs. The tiered approach addresses these needs through:

- investing in prevention for all students
- identifying and providing targeted supports for individual students who need more support
- providing individualised and intensive interventions for students with significant support needs.

Each school develops a continuum of support across the tiers that promotes student wellbeing within a school culture strongly focused on learning.

Through this framework, student assessment and instruction are linked to inform data-based decision-making. All children and young people receive universal support and instruction. If students need more support, their instructional program becomes more intensive and individualised to target their specific learning needs.
