


This term in music students over all stages have been working on either GarageBand or Chrome Music Lab to delve deep into the concepts of music and explore compositional techniques through digital composition and music production.

What Works Best: Evidence-based practices to help improve student performance.

Our fifth brief summary of high-quality, highimpact teaching strategies that our staff are looking at is assessment:

- 5. Assessment key points:
- The primary role of assessment is to establish where individuals are in their learning so that teaching can be differentiated and further learning progress can be monitored over time.
- Assessment is most effective when it is an integral part of teaching and learning programs.
- Accurate conclusions about student learning are reliant on rigorously-constructed assessment tasks, teacher collaboration and the use of marking rubrics.

Kindergarten are going to the Zoo!


On Friday 27th November Bunya and Kangaroo Paw will be going to visit the Sydney Zoo!

The bus will be leaving right on time so you **MUST** be at school by 9.10am so we can mark the roll and get ready to go. We will be back at school by 3pm.


