Glebe Public School marked Remembrance Day on Thursday, 11 November 2021.


Students watched a short video presented by our school leaders that included a reading of the Ode, the last post and the ruse with a 1-minute silence. Classes made poppies to wear for the event.

Attendance Update:

This week we have been asked many questions around attendance of students and the requirements the school needs to have students return after illness. The questions are good ones and some of those questions are as below: .

What happens if my child is sick for more than 2 days?

The department of Education stipulates that your child will require a doctor's certificate upon return to school to confirm they are well enough to come back to resume lessons. It is a good idea to grab one anyway when you are visiting the doctor for your child and include it with your child's note to their teacher.

How can I help my school with their attendance goals?

How can I help my school with their attendance goals?

- Bringing your children to school everyday
- Strive to be on time each day
- Teaching your child that being away is not negotiable - unless they are sick
- Let the school know why your child is absent or late
- Only be away for valid reasons
- Try to schedule appointments outside school hours

How can I help my school with their attendance goals?

If your child has any COVID symptoms you must have them tested and they should remain in isolation until you receive a negative test. When the negative test comes through, please have our administration staff sight it prior to your child returning. You can do this by sending a screen shot through to them through the Glebe email address.

We ask if your child is absent for any reason that you initially call the school so that we can update our rolls to account for your child. Alternatively, you can complete the attendance slip in the Sentral Parent App which feeds directly into our systems.



FIRST NATIONS BEDTIME STORIES

This week in library K - 2 students have been enjoying some of the 2020 First Nations Bedtime Stories, in preparation for the 2021 stories to begin on November 22.

Our story this week was from Yuendamu, on Warlpiri country in Central Australia, called The lost joey. It told of a little joey who fell out of his mother's pouch and searched through the mountains, desert, and spinifex grass for her, with help from some of the local animals. Students then made puppets to share and retell the story.

The First Nations Bedtime Stories initiative is a key project from Common Ground, a First Nations-led not-for-profit organisation that aims to maintain and strengthen First Nations cultures by working with First Nations Elders and knowledge custodians to share non-secret Dreaming stories with the next generation of Australians through the medium of film. They produce five stories from all over the country and share them during one week of the year. Students will be exploring more of these stories in the coming weeks.

Grown-ups might enjoy *Dreamy*, a collection of sleep stories created by First Nations storytellers. These soothing tales will help people of all walks of life to quiet their minds, connect with our land, and drift off into dream. First Nations people are the original storytellers.


