### **Toliets**

PBL Update:

Next week please discuss with your child what behaviour in the "Toilets" looks like. Students will be discussing the appropriate time to toilet themselves – before school, at recess, lunchtime and after school, ensuring they are being in the right place, at the right time.

We will also discuss the expectation that they "wipe, flush, wash, leave".

At home you can discuss appropriate behaviours in the toilet, practise washing hands properly with soap and making sure the soap is washed off and hands are dry with a towel.

## ATTENDANCE

What does the school do to encourage attendance:

- Glebe Public School creates a welcoming environment for all students to attend school and participate in learning.


