This week was Close the Gap day, an important initiative striving to communicate with the Australian government on achieving health equality for First Nations people. An event and movement that has been running since 2006, Close the Gap day is vital in sharing information, bringing people together as well as taking steps towards meaningful action. What an exciting first term I have had meeting the students at Glebe Public School. Lessons are off to a flying start with students in all grades exploring different aspects of music.

Children in Bunya and Kangaroo Paw have been learning about beat, rhythm and pitch through singing songs, playing musical games and instruments and moving their bodies. It has been very rewarding seeing their confidence grow in the short time they have been students at Glebe P.S.

In Stage 1, Waratah, Myrtle, Eucalyptus and Banksia are learning how music can be used to describe things, through an exploration of The Carnival of the Animals. The children have started learning formal music notation and experimented with building rhythm patterns through games. This week they have used clapping sticks to learn the William Tell Overture.

Paperbark, Lilly Pilli, Kurrajong and Hakea have been introduced to the concepts of music and how they underpin every piece of music we listen to. To celebrate the landing of the Perseverance Rover on Mars we learned about Gustav Holst and his famous Planets Suite. The children watched performances of the first movement, Mars, and discussed what elements of music are used in the piece as well as created artworks to represent what they heard. They even found out that Mars was the inspiration for the Darth Vader's Imperial March in Star Wars and used their literacy skills to compare and contrast the two works, before performing The Imperial March on the BookWhackers.

Boronia, Tea Tree and Wollemi have begun their semester unit on Musical Theatre. Students went right back to 1927 where modern musicals started and compared that to modern hits like Hamilton. In pairs, students created their own mini-musical about winning the lottery where they had to act, sing and dance and then perform it for the class. It is clear that there are some stars in the making amongst our Stage 3 students! It has been amazing to watch some of the students' confidence grow and perform for each other in such a short amount of time.

I can't wait to keep learning more about the amazing students and community that make up Glebe Public School!









This term in Library, Stage 3 have been learning about the publishing process.

Students have investigated some of the most published kids books of all time, created their own flip-o-ramas, their own mini books and co-created a book by adding their own text to a wordless picture book.

Over the next two weeks students will prepare a 'pitch' and plan for making their own books. There are some really wonderful works being developed!



Some facts about bullying and violence

Bullying

- Approximately one in four Year 4 to Year 9 Australian students (27%) report being builled every few weeks or more often (considered to be frequent) during the last ferm at school. Frequent school builtying was highest among Year 5 (32%) and Year 8 (29%) suidents.

Definitions of bullying, harassment, discrimination and violence

Bullying

Behaviours that do not constitute bullying include:

- mutual arguments and disagreements (where there is no power imbalance)
 not liking someone or a single act of social rejection
 ore-off acts of meanness or spile
 isolated incidents of aggression, intervidation or violence.

However, these conflicts still need to be addressed and resolved.
