Volunteering at Glebe Public School is a great way to get involved in your child's education as well as build partnerships with staff and othe parents and carers. The role of classroom volunteers is to support student learning as directed by the classroom teacher, and could include helping with reading groups, sporting events and classroom preparation.

How to become a classroom volunteer:

1. Indicate your interest and availability to your child's Assistant Principal. They will inform you on which class you will be supporting and when to start.

- 1. Complete the Working With Children Check Declaration for Child Related Workers.
- 2. Visit the school Admin Office prior to volunteering with your completed form and show one government-issued photo identity document with full name, date of birth and current residential address and, if relevant, one change of name document.
- 3. Be aware that you may not be working directly with your child's class and will be aligned with a class based on where parent volunteer support is needed.
- 4. Sign in at the Office each time you volunteer.

Parent volunteers enter into partnership with the school that is based on mutual responsibility and respect and must not discuss any information they obtain at school with anybody, other than the classroom teacher or the Principal.

COVID-smart measures

Volunteers supporting school operations and curriculum delivery must meet mandatory double vaccination requirements against COVID-19 in line with the current Public Health Order.

Volunteers should follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect our schools this winter such as the flu including staying home if unwell and practicing good hand hygiene by washing regularly with soap and water. A reminder that the school photo day is on **Friday 27 May.** If you would like to purchase school photos, please complete the details on the envelope provided this week and make payment.

Envelopes are to be returned to the office by MONDAY 23 MAY 2022. Payments cannot be accepted after this date; this specifically includes on the day of the school photos.

If you have multiple children at Glebe Public School and would like to have a sibling photo, please collect a separate envelop from the office and ensure that it is returned to the office with payment by MONDAY 23 May 2022.

Please ensure that your child has their name clearly marked on their belongings such as hats, jumpers, drink bottles, and lunch boxes/containers.

This makes it much easier for them to be returned should they be lost or misplaced.


